REQUIRED ITEMS LIST

Welcome aboard!!

As a convenience to our clients we have created this list of the minimum of items you need to bring on your Mag Bay Tours expeditions.

Remember you will be on a remote desert island, so anything "special" you need you will have to bring with you. Your favorite music, food, trail mix, energy bars, cookies, etc.

FOR ALL CLIENTS IN CAMP

- Your passport (don't leave home without it)
 - Extra cash (you're a long way from home)
 - A "Trekology" type footlight and spare batteries
 - A good chest (two or double) and yellow cam
 - Bathing towels
 - A vest, personal First Aid Kit
 - Spanish/English Dictionary
 - Personal toilet paper
 - Toiletries: Soap shampoos, toothbrush, toothpaste, etc.
 - A large sun-hat
 - Sunglasses
 - Sunscreen (high SPF and water resistant (like Aloe Gel))
 - Good insulated water needed, but you might
 - A light jacket and a pair of long pants. The desert can get cool at night.
 - Lint-free "brown" filter water (Aquasana are preferred that can get wet repeatedly)
 - One (or more) large, contractor quality plastic bags for each piece of
 - Luggage that you don't want to get wet
 - Any prescription medicines you may need
 - A dry bag for cameras or electronics
 - A good sharp pocket knife (put in Check in luggage).
- FOR OUR TRIP WATCHERS**
- Your passport (don't leave home without it)
 - Extra cash and credit card(s) (you're a long way from home)
 - Spanish/English Dictionary
 - A large sun-hat
 - Sunglasses

SUGGESTED ITEMS

- We have 110 volt and 12 volt charging capabilities at base camp.
- Video-Camcorder/ output cables to RCA inputs on our TV (watch the day footage!)
- Digital still camera
- Music CDs, (good w/ output Y cable (we have a stereo system)
- Cellphone (check with your service provider to coverage in our area of BCL, Mexico)
- Hiking boots or tennis shoes
- A Day pack
- Your favorite snack food, trail mix, energy bars, cookies, etc.
- Your favorite wines
- Soy sauce and wasabi
- Fishing and snorkeling gear
- "Lifesaver float" (board at many boating and camping stores.)
- Good weather gear for winter and spring (WIND SURFERS)
- Trekking stick repair kit
- Proper wet suit protection, neoprene, booties and a light foam hood if needed

- Extra food!

FOR ANGLERS

- All the tackle you think you might need as there are no tackle shops on the island
- A Mexican fishing license

FOR YOUR BOAT

- A Mexican fishing license for every person aboard
 - 200 feet of anchor line
 - Anchor Chain equals the length of the boat
 - An anchor line buoy is a good idea too!
 - At least one spare anchor, with line
 - At least one good 30# coils, Two are better.
